Attendance Matters

Excellent attendance at school has a major positive impact on the life chances of our learners. As a school, we expect all children to be in school at least 97% of the time. We are lucky at CHS that a high percentage of our children are in school above this figure and many in fact have a **100% attendance record.**


As you will remember from our excellent recent OFSTED report Attendance is one of our only two main areas to improve. OFSTED said...

Despite leaders' efforts, absence remains high for some pupils, especially for those who are disadvantaged. As a result, these pupils have a fractured experience of education that adversely affects their academic achievement and their opportunity to take part in the enriched curriculum. Leaders should continue to work with parents to improve pupils' attendance and engagement in school.

High attendance is a key factor in children achieving their academic potential as well as the long-term skills and character development which they will require to have at post-16 and into their future employment. Although, 90% in an examination is a very good result, sadly 90% in attendance means your child has missed 20 days of attendance in one year and across their 5-year journey, that equates to 100 days of learning, which is nearly **a whole school year!** It saddens us when we must act with the local authority for poor attendance, even more so when parents and carers are heavily fined up to £1000. We have had a number of families fined in such a way this academic year alone!

Do send your child in each day. The more frequently they are in school, for a full day, the more they develop as a young adult and the greater chance they have to achieve their academic potential.

Please avoid booking holidays in term time as they will not be authorised and the local authority is alerted and usually take further action themselves. Our Term Dates for 2023/24 are on our website to support you in this. They can be found <u>here</u>.



Punctuality Really Matters

I would also like to remind you that all children should be on site by 8.30am every morning. Gates open from 8am. Key Stage 3 children should enter via Gate 2 on Cockshut Hill, and Key Stage 4 students should access via Gate 5 on Billingsley Road. With your children being on site at this time, it enables us to welcome them and check on their perfect uniform while still enabling them to reach their tutor session by 8.40am. We also provide free bagels, drinks and fresh fruit in our restaurant or the Inclusion department. In addition to this, your child is also able to purchase food in our restaurant.

This term we have also worked with your children to emphasise the importance of getting to every lesson on time. To be organised and ambitious so knowing where their next lesson is and to arrive on time so they do not affect and disrupt the learning of others.
