

For representing the school so well in last week's 'Rock and Pop Gala' at South & City College Digbeth. Their performances were fantastic!








What if? Science Show


Crest Discovery Awards

This project was sponsored by the British Science association in collaboration with the Melinda and Bill Gates foundation and the UN program of Sustainable development Goals.










