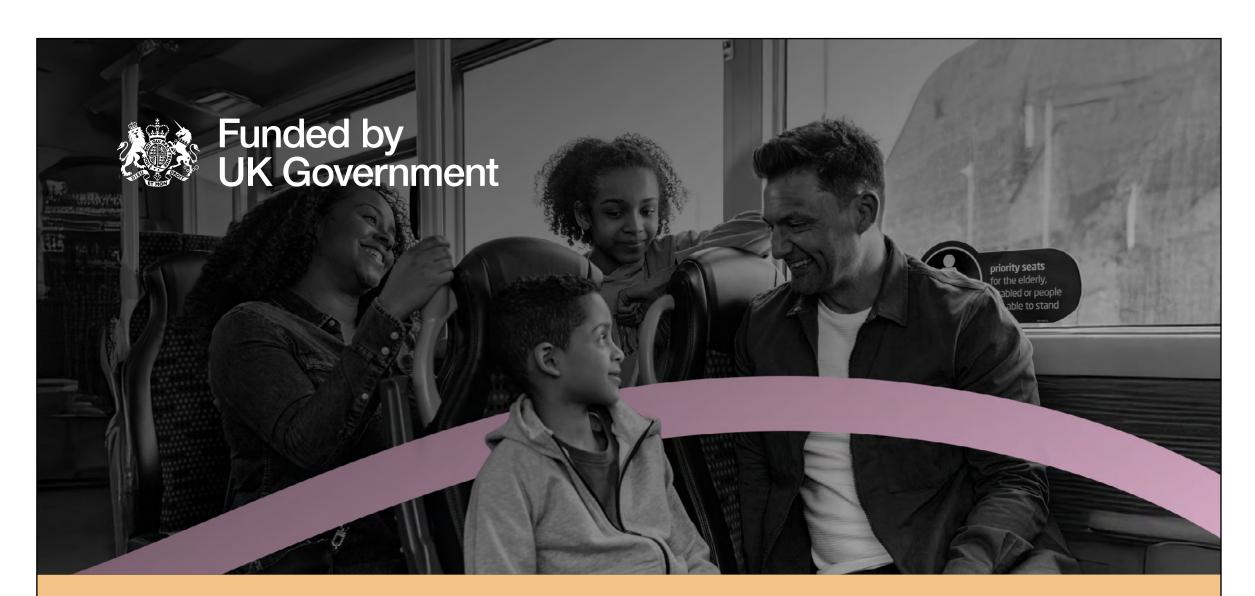

Half term Travel

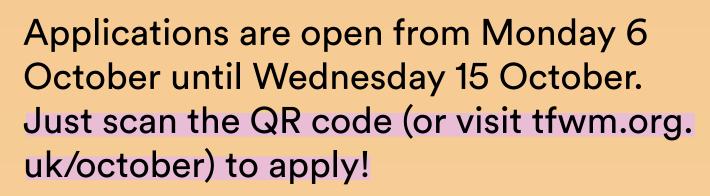


FREE bus travel for parents this October half term

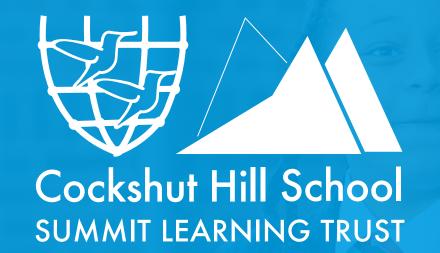

"Entertaining and very enjoyable, I loved the battle of the rhymes and winning. I learnt new vocabulary."

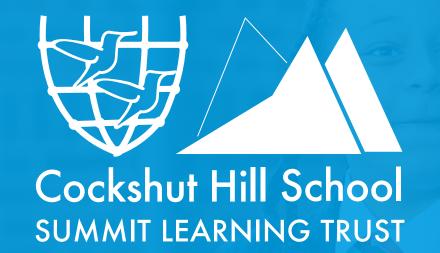
"I enjoyed performing, reading out loud my own poem to the class, built my confidence."

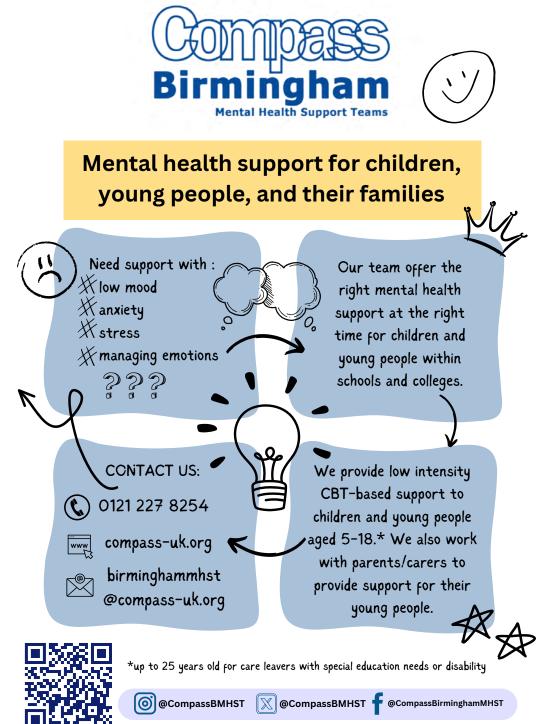


DIGITAL BOTHE WEEK
